Ann (Steward GO) is feeling optimistic. Ella (FoH) is busy with Family Samhuinn this Sunday, but Andy MacL or Jenny G have been at meetings to support Ann and she seems to be doing very well.

Tech is reported to be low on numbers. There were 2 GOs and 2 members at Walkthrough 1 (but there may be more at Walkthrough 2).

IV Fire Spinners at Eden Festival: The request is for Fire Spinners to attend and perform. However, this is not until next Summer. If there is a Fire Point at Beltane, this request will need to be discussed with them (if no Fire Point application, then consult membership).

There was a suggestion to do a costing including welfare conditions and send it to Eden to see if they are interested. It was noted that there are likely to be financial (insurance) considerations.

V Ticket information on the website and how to improve the process: Currently 4,700 tickets sold from 5,000 cap. There will be approximately 300 neighbours' pink letters to show to Stewards for admission.

It's possible to consider increasing the capacity, but that will mean extra including about £3-4,000 for the licensing. There was some discussion about when information was made available about Samhuinn eg the artist should have sent the artwork to both Board and Gabbi.

The suggestions were that the process needs to be improved and there needs to be better communication with Gabbi eg the Festival blurb needs to be passed to the Board for approval before being released on the website. It would be very helpful for Gabbi to present regular updates which can be put in a shared drive.

VI Cut off time for Torchbearers and Stewards: Cut off time for these groups is Walkthrough 2 (27/10/24). The Torchbearers group is already full, so this might not apply, but there are likely to be late applications for Stewards.

Walkthrough 2 is very close to the Festival night, which puts some pressure on last minute recruitment (that is, submitting Volunteer Agreements, Fire Safety training, Health and Safety Briefings, Safeguard checking of new recruits' names and defining the scope of Steward training to new recruits)..
